Dear Friends in Christ,

I write this a day after the weekend of celebrating the baptisms of Emric John, Bristol Mary and Brexlee Louise into our church family! What a joy and privilege to witness the gift of salvation for each of these precious children.

One of the lectionary readings from that weekend was from Acts 8 in which the Ethiopian eunuch was baptized. The eunuch hears the good news of Jesus's life, death, and resurrection and decides to become a follower of Christ and asks Philip an amazing question, "what is to prevent me from being baptized?" I wondered upon hearing those words what was to prevent little Emric, Bristol or Brexlee from belonging to the family of God? What was there to prevent them from being welcomed as Christ's own? What was there to prevent them from full participation in the risen life and community of Jesus? What was to prevent them from becoming, not merely a hearer of the Good News, but an integral part of the Good News of resurrection?

In the story from Acts nobody answers the eunuch's question as it is met with silence. And the answer is still silence for nothing is preventing Brexlee Louise, Bristol Mary or Emric John or anyone from being welcomed into the family of God through Christ. Nothing prevents a person from entering into the fullness of Christ's salvation.

In his beautiful commentary on the book of Acts, theologian Willie James Jennings describes the story of the eunuch this way: "Faith found the water. Faith will always find the water." The eunuch wanted God as much as God wanted him.

As we move out of the Easter season it is important to continue to ask ourselves what difference the resurrection makes in the way we live and practice our faith. Is Easter but a mountaintop experience we briefly enjoy but then leave behind to return to "real" life? Is our Easter experience spreading the good news and welcoming others into the body of Christ? May we embrace the wideness of God's embrace and His capacity to lead his beloved ones to baptism and new life in Christ. The Spirit will do what the Spirit will do! Let us venture into this new month awake and alert to all Christ is doing in our midst.



All games must be new and sealed in the box. More than one of a certain game can be donated.


They are also in need of rain ponchos for the reentry program.
