Next meeting: July 7, 2024.



Dear Friends in Christ,

Since visiting and worshipping at St. Dysmas last month, one scripture in particular has been living in my heart. The writer of Hebrews instructs: "Stay on good terms with each other, held together by love. Be ready with a meal or a bed when it's needed. Why, some have extended hospitality to angels without ever knowing it! Regard prisoners as if you were in prison with them." (Hebrews 13: 1-3, *The Message* translation) The encouragement is part of a more extensive teaching on showing God's love to fellow Christians.

Demonstrating God's love means treating each other as we would treat our own family members. Hebrews 13: 1-2 when referencing entertaining angels without knowing it" alludes to Abraham and Sarah entertaining visitors (Genesis 18: 1-15) who turn out to be angels (Gen. 19:1), the very bearers of the promise of a son to Abraham and Sarah. There are countless biblical passages reminding us of the many acts of hospitality by Jesus and by those who followed him.

Gracious hospitality are the words I would use to describe my worship experience at St. Dysmas. Our group were the guests and we were warmly welcomed by Pastor Jeff and the inmates. We were treated with genuine kindness and a joyful welcome. We were guests in their church. We did not arrive with a message to share or news from the "outside." We did not arrive with hopes of sharing worldly advice or pep talks about staying positive. It was simple actually; we were guests in their church and if you've ever visited a church full of friendly people then you know exactly what I'm talking about. We were Christians experiencing the miracle of Pentecost and frankly I can think of no better scripture than the re-telling of how all believers were in one place when the Holy Spirit came upon them. It wasn't "us" and "them"....it was we...believers united by the Holy Spirit in the name of our Savior and Redeemer, Jesus Christ.

Hospitality is a great act of faith yet one of the most underrated. Hospitality is one of the most significant acts of service that human beings can do. When we entertain strangers, we are showing hospitality to Jesus Christ our Lord and demonstrating God's love. I was the stranger on a Wednesday afternoon upon entering the Penitentiary chapel yet within minutes I was greeted by an usher who smiled, welcomed me and handed me a bulletin. Together we worshipped, prayed, sang and shared in Holy Communion together as believers.

May every interaction we have with a server, an employee, the person standing behind us in the check-out line, be seen as a chance to make someone feel seen. Imagine the witness to God's love if Christians had a reputation for hospitality in the course of our everyday lives. Sharing In Ministry, Pastor Teri
