
Rise, O bones, from this forgotten grave, naked, flesh long since shred by time and loss. Arise.

Backpacks for St. Dysmas program

The ReEntry Program Coordinator, Mitch Wilson, states that the backpacks

from https://www.citypak.org are durable and roomy with bedroll ties. Usually the other backpacks are smaller and more challenging to use. Those who are released from the Minnehaha County Jail are also in the program, so he distributes on the average 10-12 backpacks per month.

Mj has committed to ordering six backpacks per month for the program. The total cost for 6 backpacks is \$177 (\$162 + \$15 shipping) which is \$29.50/each - actually a reasonable charge if you've shopped for these lately! If any others are interested in donating funds towards this efforts, please let Mj know.
