
Maundy Thursday service and communion will be at 7 PM at the Church 4/17/25 with Good Friday service at 7 PM on 4/18/2025

Dear Friends in Christ,

This month we observe Ash Wednesday and begin our Lenten journey. For many years of my life I gave up something for Lent as a spiritual discipline. On Ash Wednesday, the first day of the Lenten season, I would make a commitment to give up something that I enjoyed as my exercise in self-denial. It was usually something I liked such as popcorn or diet coke. One year I cheated and treated myself to diet cokes on Sunday as someone told me Sundays didn't count for fasting and abstinence during Lent.

But a few years ago this all changed after reading a devotional book. I now go about this in a totally different way. As I read my Lenten devotional and prayed about what I would give up for Lent, a new inspiration came to me.

If I was going to give up something for Lent, why not choose something bad? If I was going to sacrificially give up something for Lent as a spiritual discipline and as an exercise in selfdenial, why not pick out something that I really needed to get out of my life permanently? Instead of giving up desserts, popcorn or diet coke, why not choose something that spiritually I would be much better without? Why not choose certain acts or certain habits or certain sins that have the power to contaminate, infect, or poison my soul? Why not give up one of those for Lent? Why not intentionally decide, with the help of God, to put our energy and efforts into ridding ourselves of something that is spiritually destructive in our lives, something like envy or self-pity or apathy or gossip or resentment of negative thinking? Why not give up something bad for Lent in the hope and with the prayer that if we can give up that particular sin for the forty days of Lent then, maybe, God can give us the strength to give it up forever?

Our mid-week Lenten services begin Wednesday, March 12, and the focus each week will be on giving up something bad for Lent. It is my hope and prayer that as we travel the Lenten road together through scripture, prayer and worship, we will be inspired and encouraged this year as never before to give up something that is spiritually bad for us so we may be better prepared to receive the good news of Easter.

Please note the schedule for our soup suppers/ worship services as we will be sharing worship with the White UMC. Soup will be served from 5:30-6:30 with worship at 6:30.




